

UK and Ireland Libraries EDI update

EDI leads from SCONUL and other regional and national consortia meet three times a year to discuss how to effectively coordinate our EDI activity and share information and resources.

Academic Libraries North

1. EDI Innovation Fund

The outputs from the six projects from the pilot EDI Innovation Fund, which ran from January – July 2023 are now available on the ALN Equality, Diversity & Inclusion webpage. Members of the EDI Action Group facilitated an event with presentations from the six projects in December, with the aim of celebrating the achievements of the scheme and encouraging applications for the second wave of the scheme, which is now open with a closing date of 29 February. As a reminder, the aims of the fund are to provide small grants to ALN institutions (up to a max of £500) to support a project, event or activity which will improve, enhance or develop approaches to EDI.

In addition to running the Innovation Fund, in November 2024 the group organised an event on Equality Impact Assessments (EIAs) in practice, with presentations from ALN members who have introduced EIAs into their practice when implementing new services or policies, and when reviewing existing ones.

2. EDI events 2024

The EDI Action Group plans to run a staff development session in the second part of 2024 focusing on the involvement ALN members have had with their University's University of Sanctuary bid or implementation group. Other EDI events will include a Learning Exchange during the Summer facilitated by the ALN Enabling Group.

3. Global Equity Network and Action Learning Set

The organising group has also been working further on the Global Equity Network (GEN), The Terms of Support and ethos of the group was presented at the ALN Board in November 2023 for ratification. It has now begun promotion within and outside ALN, with a membership touching 50 people already. The organising group has also been successful in securing funding through UKSG's Innovation Award. This programme aims to support, empower, and create opportunities for positive change for Library, Information and Knowledge (including galleries, archives, etc.) workers from global majority/Black, Asian and Ethnic Minority (BAME) backgrounds.

Through UKSG's support, there will be a series of ALS events, including one in-person event at the University of Leeds with bursaries available for travel and four remote events. These will be supported by trained facilitators and open to BAME staff at all levels within the Library, Information and Knowledge sector.

1. 2024 Annual Conference – EDI highlights

- Keynotes from Dr Althea Greenan, curator of the Women's Art Library at Goldsmiths, University of London, and renowned authors Sara Sheridan and Eleanor Thom, in conversation on why libraries are integral to telling the hidden stories of women past and present
- Parallel sessions on Seeing Differently: How to make your libraries accessible to blind and partially sighted users with RNIB - complementing our online learning with RNIB this August on Accessible Technology in Libraries - as well as Supporting Vulnerable Users in Public Libraries; Taking PRIDE in inclusive archives, and Managing Safe and Inclusive Public Library Services: A practical guide from CILIP
- In a conference first, we will also be joined by gifted graphic facilitator Clare Mills, who will create a unique artwork to serve as a lasting legacy of CILIPS24: illustrating the key ideas shared, professional knowledge exchanged and new networks generated to especially support visual learners
- From a climate justice perspective, we'll be literally growing our Green Libraries Scotland x CILIPS24 activities: utilizing an exclusively digital programme plus a reduced food/water waste strategy and a locally-produced vegetarian lunch menu, relaunching our car sharing scheme for delegates, including signposting to electric car charging points, and featuring recycled lanyards along with carbon captured name badges (including a tree-planting donation to the Woodland Trust) and other sustainably sourced items in our legendary conference 'swag bags'!

2024 Annual Seminar

The CONUL Teaching and Learning Committee invite you to attend their 2024 Annual Seminar – **“Defining ‘AI’ in Teaching & Learning: the role of libraries in Access and Inclusion; Academic Integrity; and Artificial Intelligence”**.
